



















Archive Edition Togane City Proper Disposal of Household Garbage

- Garbage should be taken to designated collecting locations prior to **8:00 am** only on designated collecting days.
- Garbage, which is not put in specified bags or properly separated will not be collected.

How to separate	Items to include	How to dispose
Combustible garbage  Use Togane City specified Yellow bags	Kitchen refuse, paper trash, vinyl bags, fabrics, plastic containers other than Plastic bottles (e.g. containers for detergent, shampoo, edible oil), polystyrene foam, hides and leather (e.g. shoes, bags), paper diapers and twigs  <div> Identification mark  </div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Drain excess moisture from kitchen waste, and dry any wet garbage. Also use specified Yellow bags when disposing newspapers, magazines and cardboard boxes Any long items such as hoses must be cut into 1 meter pieces. Remove any metal parts from plastic products. (If it is not possible, please dispose as "Metals")
Metals  Use Togane City specified Green bags.	Spoons, pots, kettles, small electrical appliances (e.g. rice cooker, water boiler, toaster etc.) knives, cords, wires 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Always cut the cords of small appliances. Cut the cords into approximately 1m long pieces and tie them up. (Put them all in the same bag.) Nails should be placed in a bag or box and mark "nails." Sharp items such as knives or needles should be handled properly to prevent accidents, and marked as "dangerous."
Cans  Use Togane City specified Green and Red bags	Cans used for beverages, canned food, sweets, tea, coffee, edible oil and spray cans.  <div> Identification mark  </div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Empty the cans, rinse with water and dry.. As for spray cans, completely empty the contents prior to disposal and puncture the can in order to release internal air.
Glass bottles  Use Togane City specified Green bags.	Empty bottles, glass products, mirrors, plates, rice bowls and other crockery. <div> <div> Glass bottles bags  </div> <div> To separate into different bags  </div> </div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Empty, rinse with water and dry. "Bottles" and "Glass/Ceramics" should be grouped according to their types and put into separate garbage bags. Remove the lid and sort it into "Metals" or "Combustible garbage". Broken glass should be wrapped in paper or similar and marked as "dangerous".
Plastic Bottles  Use Togane City specified Green and Red bags	Bottles for soft drink, liquor and soy sauce (only those with recycle marks)  <div> Identification mark  </div>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Empty, rinse with water and dry. Lid → Attach it to the bottle when putting it out. Label → Remove it and dispose as Combustible garbage. Lightly crush to reduce volume. Plastic containers and products without identification marks, such as shampoo, should be disposed as "Combustible garbage".
Batteries  Use any semi transparent bag (e.g. plastic bags provided at retail store checkout counters)	Manganese batteries, alkaline batteries (dry batteries), lithium dry batteries, coin batteries, button batteries, rechargeable batteries (including small appliances where the rechargeable battery cannot be removed). 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> To prevent fires, insulate the battery's positive and negative terminals with cellophane tape and never mix it with other garbage. Small appliances that do not allow battery removal should be disposed of as batteries. You may also use the collection boxes located next to the reception desk at city hall, each community center, and Fureai center. Lead storage batteries should be taken to a dealership or a professional disposal service.
Fluorescent lamps  Use transparent bags, or place in original case when purchased	fluorescent lamp, fluorescent tube, light bulb, bead light bulb, mercury thermometer 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> Do not divide before discarding it. (If it's broken, wrap it in paper and mark it as "Dangerous") Try to put it in its original case that you bought it in or take other precautions so that it won't break. Digital thermometers should be disposed of as "Metals". Small items, like light bulbs, should be put in a clear bag so their contents are visible.
